It was the perfect prelude to a fabulous dinner and concert in front of the Celsus Library, a setting which cannot be duplicated."

IF I WERE THERE ...

- Sail around **Santorini** in a catamaran, stopping to swim in the Caldera’s warm waters — "The island is so beautiful," says David, "that only from a boat can you see all of the terrain and colors, and really feel like you are in Greece."
- Take advantage of a late night in **Rhodes** to visit the 2nd-century acropolis and Palace of the Grand Masters, one of many medieval treasures in the UNESCO-designated Old City
- Enjoy another late evening in Agios Nikolaos to soak in **Crete’s** natural beauty — David suggests finding an outdoor café overlooking the harbor: "I lingered over what must have been a three-hour lunch ... I simply did not want to leave."
- Watch **Mykonos’** windmills and shop its chic boutiques during an overnight call, which also allows time to explore the UNESCO-designated ruins on nearby Delos
- Lose yourself in tiny **Monemvasia** with its charming shops, wine bars, and cafés — "Mateo’s at the pier is one of the finest for authentic local delicacies like clams, sardines, and grilled fish, enjoyed beneath blue umbrellas."
