During this 4-hour walking tour you'll be able walk through the main highlights of Lisbon's historical center while learning the untold story of the Jewish presence in Lisbon.

You will walk through Rossio square, Chiado, Baixa, Alfama and Comercio square. While this can be your orientation walking tour of Lisbon, the focus will be the Jewish presence in these areas, the layout of the streets and what once happened in each place. Stand where the horrible massacre of 1506 occurred and understand how and why it happened. Did you know that in medieval times there were two Jewish communities, so important they'd answer directly to the king? Walk by those areas and discover what they became today. Listen to quotes from "The last Kabbalist of Lisbon", a real story, while walking through those same streets.

Discover the importance of the Jewish community for the age of discoveries and how the expulsion of 1496 is linked to the decay of Portugal itself. Learn how the need to blend-in made "new-Christians" create a Kosher sausage that is still enjoyed by Catholics today. More recently, we were the safe place for those fleeing from central Europe, having our own "Oskar Schindler", Aristides Sousa Mendes. Different earthquakes, as well as the Catholic Inquisition, destroyed most of the physical Jewish presence but the story still lives to be told.

Have more time in Lisbon? Drive by Lisbon's synagogue and visit the 19th century Jewish cemetery and tour Belem. You'll cover all the highlights of a regular city tour while learning the information that matters to you.

What's included? An 8-hour tour with a licensed guide, entrance fees to the Jewish cemetery, and transportation in a luxury vehicle.

Did you know that "Obidos" means "fortified city" in Latin? The name speaks for itself.

Famous for the narrow streets with whitewashed walls, colorful bougainvillea spilling over from the balconies and the endless handicraft shops, Obidos has always retained its authenticity over time.

While Obidos doesn't have any religious significance, it is an interesting medieval village still kept within the old city walls. Not far we can find Tomar where the oldest synagogue in the country can be found.

Although small in space, it's full of history and also hosts a Jewish Museum. A walk though the historical will reveal more interesting details. If you're interested we can also visit the monastery, once property of the Portuguese branch of the Templar Knights.

Tomar has the best preserved medieval synagogue in Portugal. It was built in the 15th century and its singular interior has Gothic vaults and columns with classic capitals. Since 1939 it has housed the small Abraão Zacuto Jewish Museum, with interesting pieces related to the history of Jews in Portugal.

Evora was declared by UNESCO as a world heritage site and it's not hard to understand why, with its quaint historical center.

Here we'll visit the Roman temple, the narrow streets that once formed the Jewish ghetto, the main square and the Bones Chapel.

The Roman Temple of Évora, also referred to as the Templo de Diana. It is an ancient temple in the Portuguese city of Évora (civil parish of Sé e São Pedro). The temple is part of the historical centre of the city, which was included in the classification by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site. It represents one of the most significant landmarks relating to the Roman and Lusitanian civilizations of Évora and in Portuguese territory.


The Jewish Quarter in Évora was one of the biggest, richest and most important jewish quarters in the country. No wonder, since this was the second Portuguese city during the Middle Ages.

Starting in the 14th century, the jews in Portugal were forced to live in their own neighbourhoods, named "Judiarias" (Jewish Quarters). This way, the interaction between christians and jews was limited. Their rights were also limited. A lot.

The Bones Chapel is one of the best known monuments in Évora, Portugal. It is a small interior chapel located next to the entrance of the Church of St. Francis. The Chapel gets its name because the interior walls are covered and decorated with human skulls and bones.



Today, your expert guide will introduce you to the history of the only surviving peninsular community of descendants of Sephardic Jews.

The Marranos living in Belmonte, a town in central Portugal, are sometimes referred to as the "Belmonte Jews." They are a Jewish community that lived in secrecy for hundreds of years by maintaining a tradition of endogamy and by hiding all the external signs of their faith.

Your guide will take you through the historical quarter of the town and the Jewish Museum to give you a detailed look at the Jewish presence here and throughout Portugal, and the historical significance of the community.

When the tour finishes our guide will accompany you to your Hotel in Porto.

Visit to the historical center of Porto (Clerigos Tower and Church, Lello bookshop (outside only), Aliados Avenue (main square), Sao Bento train station, Cathedral, Porto's oldest neighborhood, square of Infante, Douro river riverfront, Luis I iron bridge), but under the theme to: "the old 4 Jewish neighborhoods in Porto - places where the Jewish communities lived from the 12th to the 15th century".

Pass by the St. Francis church to witness a very special and impressive altar/shrine about the old and new testament.

In the afternoon, you will visit the Synagogue followed by the Port Wine lodge/cellar.

See the historic sites of Coimbra and Aveiro. Marvel at the diverse landscapes of Portugal's Centro Region of Portugal, taste the local food, discover one of the oldest universities in Europe, and more.

Escape the hustle and bustle of Lisbon city center on a private full-day tour of the Centro Region of Portugal. Following a pick-up from your hotel, transfer to the capital of the Centro at Coimbra. Upon arrival, explore the narrow streets and see architecture that dates from the Baroque to the Renaissance to the modern.

Look at the austere façade of the Sé Nova de Coimbra (New Cathedral of Coimbra), and admire one of the most important Romanesque Roman Catholic buildings in Portugal at the Sé Velha de Coimbra (Old Cathedral of Coimbra).

Find Arab influences from the Moors on the narrow streets of the city center, and see architecture with Roman origins. Sample food from the region, and meet the friendly locals. Learn about the 13th-century origins of one of the oldest universities in Europe, and discover the Pantheon of Portugal's 1st two kings.
